RE-ENTRY ROADMAP: A path to a fresh start.

Housing is an essential component of the reentry process for individuals once they are free. There are housing programs that not only address the immediate needs for a place to live but also offer support such as job training, employment support, mental health service, healthcare, substance abuse counseling, rental help etc. These programs help individuals to transition back to the community successfully. One such example is called **Freedom** *House* (an HRA Supportive Housing Program): an emergency and transitional housing unit for

emergency and transitional housing unit for adult men. Freedom House provides housingvulnerable and at-risk participants with a safe and supportive place to live with access to services, and the goal of transitioning to permanent housing. A personal testimony from a son of God awaiting freedom

Society has a way of putting labels on people when they are not considered "normal" or when they are deemed not capable. When people are limited in some way, we tend to use our own emotions and challenges as a gauge of measurement. The term awareness is not only used to identify a person or define a spectrum, but more importantly, it needs to be used to understand the conditions that shape us from within. This is my testimony about unlimited possibilities and the superheroes who help guide us through life. I was a heroin addict, a thief, a repeat offender, a "frequent flyer" in the system. Not just a bad person, but also a bad father, a bad brother, a bad son, and even a bad inmate. My addiction started extremely early with cigarettes, then beer, then later weed, and eventually prescription pills and heroin. I always said it was not my fault but my parents' fault, for example, their divorce, a broken home, or childhood exposure to illicit things. My mom & dad were alcoholics, so it became easy for me to follow their footsteps. I lied to myself constantly that I could maintain some more moderation when indulging in my voice. I thought it would make me more sociable and help me concentrate better, but I just couldn't control it. I was in prison several times and it robbed me of much of my life



but when my wife passed away it was hard on me. To be honest, I missed the opportunity to tell her goodbye or to tell her that I loved her. My mental state and addiction impacted my child's development.

Through my struggles, I have come to understand redemption. I have come to believe in second chances. I tell no sugarcoated story; I tell no sweetened past, but my life changed unexpectedly in my most recent incarceration. There are people placed in our lives who help guide us toward a better path, whether we recognize them at the time or not. Sometimes, those people come to the most unexpected places, even in prison. I have met a fellow son of God who has become my Superman. He is a mentor, a man of Christ, and is now my greatest friend. He is everything you would expect from a superhero. His actions are selfless and inspirational, and he has touched my life beyond comprehension. Despite many prison programs and vocational requirements, I never really received any help and did not experience "correction". God sent him to be my spiritual angel, who

has opened my eyes and showed me a new vision. He introduced me to a spiritual life



which is something I had never known or experienced before. He helped me understand forgiveness, how to forgive, gave me purpose and made me believe in second chances. I know now what I must do. I need to continue this new path. I can succeed and continue to walk forward in faith. I'm proud to say that through accountability, hard work, and obedience, this friend who mentored me showed me that my old life is behind me now. God will not return me to my old life because I am now His son. I am now resurrected. I also know that my family is very proud of me. Today, when I speak to my mom, she breaks down in joy, saying, "Lord, thank you for returning my son to me." I no longer have a broken spirit and no longer dream just of survival. I have hope, purpose, and I am a witness that everything I do matters. Thank you, God, for granting me this wonderful person who is not just my very great friend but my brother and family. I now pray every day for his health, wellbeing and his release. I thank him for aligning me spiritually and bringing me back to Christ.

Remember it says in Hebrews 13:2-3 'Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels without knowing it. Continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated as if yourself were suffering..'
